Next Meeting March 4th. - Our presentation this month will be hosted by Jim Marlow of Marlow's Orchids near Rochester, NY. He will be hosting our Orchid Compotting Clinic, and will be bringing various orchids and potting materials to the meeting.

Last time Jim hosted the mounting clinic, there was a mob rush from people wanting to buy plants as he was bringing them in and trying to set up for the clinic. This year, no sales will be made until all plants are brought in, he has set up and we are ready for action (smile). Please refrain this year, it made things very hectic and confusing. There will be plenty of good plants and materials for everyone. Note that if you would like a plant from his greenhouse, check out his website and www.marloworchids.com and make arrangements for getting it at the meeting.

Please note that there will be neighboring orchid societies holding shows this Spring, including the big show down in New York City. The Genesee Region Orchid Society (GROS) will be holding its show at the Eisenhart Museum in Rochester, NY from March 31st through April 1st, with setup on the Thursday before the show (3/29). The Southern Tier Orchid Society (STOS) will be holding its show at the Oakdale Mall in Johnson City, NY April 27th through the 29th, with setup the Thursday before (4/26). We will be having a display at each of these shows. If you would like to help with setup, takedown or offer plants for the display, please talk to one of the officers at one of the meetings. I'm sure there will be handouts circulating with time slots where people can sign up. If you would like to enter plants in the display, think now about properly presenting them for showing. That means staking an inflorescence so that the flowers are properly displayed, repotting the plant so that it is healthiest for the show, and removing all pests and/or diseases or browned leaves. There will be determined times and place for plant collection and return. Please note that we can always use non-flowering non-orchidaceous plants in the display as fillers and backdrop material. Note that anyone can also display orchid art and photos in these shows.

EXPANDING HORIZONS: Books of interest

BEYOND THE LAST VILLAGE Alan Rabinowitz, 2001 by Island Press, Washington, D.C.

“Pointing out orchids ranging from specimens the size of my thumbnail hidden on the forest floor to spectacularly lush arboreal assemblages high in the forest canopy, U Saw Lwin educated me about the relationship between orchids' floral structure and the animals that pollinate them. Many of the more than 850 orchid species native to Myanmar depended on bees, moths, butterflies, birds, and even bats for pollination. Some orchids could be pollinated only by a single species of insect.”

As an armchair Marco Polo, I am always looking for books to take me where my limited means cannot. Like most books by explorers, this one reveals the broad scope of the trip and only minimally addresses orchids specifically. However, it is no less interesting because what is encountered is exceptional.

Myanmar until 1989 was known as Burma. This book is a journey into the “lost world” of unexplored areas of northern Myanmar. This area is located at the southeast edge of the Himalayas where tropical rain forest and snow-covered mountains join. The government allowed Rabinowitz to travel with his team from the Wildlife Conservation Society into areas formerly off limits to everyone. They immerse themselves in primitive cultures giving them the necessary insights to better understand the people and how they live in this challenging environment. New plants are discovered along with animals unique to this area, from the only pygmies of Asian ancestry to animals few have heard of, much less ever seen, like the golden takin or black barking deer. The physical and mental endurance of the participants was extraordinary. This book is a scientific exploration as well as a personal journey of discovery for the author. It definitely lives up to its title and takes you “beyond the last village”. A very enjoyable read.
